## United Council on Opioids

In January 2019, the United Council on Opioids was formed in Monticello by seventy community stakeholders to reduce substance-related deaths, prevent substance misuse, and provide resources for those already involved in substance abuse.

Three task-force groups: Treatment, Prevention, and Recovery, meet monthly to accomplish their goals. To date we have:



- Increased awareness of substance use and promoted recovery through two billboard campaigns
- Engaged fifth-graders in an original play "We are the Champions" to promote opioid awareness
- Facilitated the expansion of the Tippecanoe Quick Response team into White County
- Mapped protocols in treatment and recovery systems to develop strategies to fill in gaps in services
